



Wildlife Services Technician – Level I Plateau Land and Wildlife Management

All Applicants must have a valid Texas Drivers License and current insurance.

Location: Dripping Springs / Austin, TX

Salary: \$9.50 - \$12 per hour

Job Description:

A Level I Wildlife Services Technician (Technician) will be expected to participate in all aspects of land and wildlife management. Known job activities will include installation of various wildlife related products including: rainwater collection systems, Turkey/Deer feeders, and bird nesting boxes. Other wildlife related services to be performed include: brush control (juniper by chain saw, prickly pear/mesquite by herbicide application), imported red fire ant treatments, feeder refills, spotlight surveys for deer (occurring after normal business hours), and site visits to monitor nest boxes and/or maintain existing wildlife related products.

Plateau Land and Wildlife Management has a service area that includes multiple counties in Texas. **All Technicians must be prepared for occasional long drive times to and from client properties. The position requires extended periods of heavy physical labor, often in irregular terrain. Physical fitness and endurance are required.**

Job Requirements:

- **Technicians must exhibit a willingness to work in all weather conditions and have the ability to interact in a professional manner with clients.**
- Technicians must be able to navigate to remote properties and then exercise the ability to orientate/navigate within the property using maps and GPS.
- A reliable pick up truck is mandatory (mileage reimbursed). Full size, crew cab, four wheel drive vehicles preferred. Technicians must be willing to use their vehicles off road.
- Experience with power tools, chain saws, and other two-cycle powered equipment is mandatory.
- Ability to work in a team setting within the Products & Services Division and with senior biologists, and landowners is crucial.
- Position requires organization, attention to detail, and efficient record keeping, which includes map creation using ArcView, recording information using GPS and the use of a digital camera.
- Ability to safely operate an ATV is required.
- A working knowledge and appreciation of wildlife and plant species important to land and wildlife are preferred.
- Bachelor's degree in a land or wildlife related field a plus.

Schedule will typically be up to 40 hours/week with the potential for overtime depending on season and extreme weather conditions.
